

Eglwys Sant Pedr syml gyda phorth derw, mae wedi'i

St Peter's Church

- the nave was built in the C15

and the chancel in the C16 forming a simple rectangular plan with a fine open oak porch, grade II* listed.

Standing Stones - as the River Artro is the only navigable river in Ardudwy, it is thought these stones denoted a prehistoric landing place - one stone is over three metres tall.

Clawdd Llanw - adeiladwyd y cloddiau gan Syr afon ac adennill tir.

Tidal embankment - built in early C19 by Sir Thomas Mostyn to channel the river and reclaim land.

Pont y Coroni - adeiladwyd

Coronation Bridge - built to celebrate George V's coronation in 1911, the current bridge replaced the old one in 2010.



Cei Pensarn - codwyd yn coed a chalch.

> Pensarn Quay - the quay was built in the 1820s to export slates from Llanbedr and Llanfair quarries, and to import timber and lime.



Cored Bysgota - codwyd nifer o'r argaeau bychain yma i ffurfio pyllau pysgota yn y C19 pan oedd

Fishing Weir - many of these low dams were built in the C19 to form fishing pools when Llanbedr became a popular fishing centre. Many of the large houses in the village served as accommodation for fishermen and visitors.

A pleasant short and level circular walk, starting in Llanbedr village, passing notable and historic sites including: St Peters Church, the Standing Stones, and continuing along the embankment of the River Artro, with the option of a short detour to Pensarn Harbour.
