Committee Reports

Gwynedd Council Matters - Councillor Annwen Hughes

- 1. The re surfacing of Mochras Road has completed now and the work had gone well.
- 2. Complaints regarding the cutting of the grass verges brought to the attention of Adrian Williams Gwynedd Council. The Community Council needs to support this, and to write also.
- 3. New Road spoken to Meirion Williams YGC regarding the delay. They have had a meeting with the National Park Authority and things are developing. Documents expected to be in the Park by October. Delay because another bat study has to be done the present one is too old, and needs updating, and ecology studies.
- 4. Moriah Chapel Planning Application this has been approved, but that is not to say that the developer of the proposed Mosque has actually purchased the site. Regarding the bats etc, an application for this will be required in August either to carry out a bat survey or alterations to the plans, thus not including any velux windows in the roof of the vestry. Aled Lloyd is now the Park officer responsible for Llanbedr area.
- 5. Pentre Gwynfryn Bridge footbridge. Requested a hand rail to facilitate walking from the roadside to and from the bridge via the steps. The Clerk noted that something was also needed to prevent children going down from the left-hand side of the bridge down to the river again near the road. Dangerous drop to the river.
- 6. Lowri Howie Fferm Dinas, a pupil at Ysgol Llanbedr has received an award of Primary Pupil of the Year at the Anglesey and Gwynedd School Sport Awards 2018/19 and also was given the award for the Sportsperson of the Year recently.
- 7. Scrutiny committee for GC they have recommended that a financial penalty be imposed on people who leave their refuse bins and recycle bins on the pavement or road for a period after the collection. AH noted in committee that the workforce should also have to be tidier with the work of emptying bins. The matter will be discussed further at a cabinet meeting.
- 8. Year 9 pupils from Ysgol Ardudwy are not pursuing any community work this year. Plenty of tidying up around the school.
- 9. The Clerk added that she had received a complaint regarding the cutting of the grass verge. External work outside 30mile limit signs. This has been directed to Gwynedd Council with a copy of the email received from a member of the public.
- 10. Following the recent accident between a motor vehicle and a pedestrian at Llanbedr it became clear that road safety issues needed to be reconsidered. Robin Ward noted his concerns in an e-mail. It was agreed to forward to Adrian Williams. Issues of speeding, no pavement through the village.
- 11. This would also be more problematic if something was to develop in the Moriah Chapel. Also road safety has to be put in place in the event of the New Road coming or not.
- 12. Has also reported the need for grass cutting near lay-by Cae Nest Road (Bron Pwll).
- 13. Harlech Motor Club understood that this will be on the Saturday June 2020 after all. Too many motorcycles on the road on a Sunday. The Clerk noted that they had a beneficial meeting with the Police and with Gwynedd Council.

Woodland / footpath project committee - Councillor Caroline Evans

Had a very useful meeting with Bill Smutts graphic designer from Caergwrle. An estimate for leaflet design will be £ 775. Take 3 months to complete. Create a leaflet to put on the website firstly, and for handouts, and also for the display board. This shows the cycle of the 4 routes.

Other woodland signs will be installed by the end of the year.

Need planning permission to install the display board opposite the Victoria. Cost o £ 195 for the Council. G.Price will continue with this.
