Meeting Reports

1. Ardudwy Forum – Llanbedr, Dyffryn Ardudwy, Harlech Councils present

Apologies from Bermo and Talsarnau.

Mentioned that only one company is interested in the HAL site at present. Hotel company.

Celtic. Make room for Leisure and a Swimming Pool as well.

Also mentioned the Arfon and Dwyfor Councils where the County Council looks after playgrounds? AH and GO to look into this.

Also, that some Harlech Councillors take the allowance and some give it back to the Management Committee for the Library room.

AH noted that the Community Council owns the Tennis Club, and the Band Room belongs to Harlech Band.

2. Biodiversity / Cemetery

This is very difficult, as a balance is needed between tidiness and wildlife.

* Hywel Wyn to give a price for clearing the stones and old compost £200. Approved to go ahead with the work.

- * John Thomas has given a price of £1000 + VAT for clearing the cemetery spraying the ivy? This is not good for the environment, so the ivy needs to be cut very carefully to avoid damaging the graves.
- * Memorial bench The owner wants to remove it.
- * Also cutting trees in the cemetery.

Confirm that permission has been obtained to cut a tree between two graves.

- *Growth rose tree looking good now with flowers on it, but it will soon get out of control. ETH to speak with the Family, maybe move it to a corner somewhere!
- * Alex Mede has done a very good job on the cemetery path power washed the moss. No charge for this work. Had to do this for safety. Better for the environment.
- *Cae Deiliog *Translating TEAMS and Zoom RW has been researching the best tools for this suitable microphones. It was agreed that he would order them.
- *CCTV cameras unable to find a location in Llanbedr to install the hubs and recorder. What about installing them near the Hall/School? Cylch Meithrin. This will start since £2400 has been allocated? Perhaps the School should apply for grants towards this?

County Councillors' Reports Report by Cllr. Gwynfor Owen

1. Case against former headteacher of School in Bangor in which Gwynedd Council lost 58 opportunities. Nia Jeffries emphasized and apologized that it was a fault of the system, and that

something like this must never happen again. – need to trim a hedge here. Eirwyn has received a quote of £3000. About 150 meters of hedge in the playground. Trimming this hedge will add to biodiversity. Maybe consider applying for a grant.

- 1. Need to order a liner for the Bear Bin and also a New Lock.
- 2. That Gwynedd Council is looking to fill a £15 million gap in this year's budget. Raise the council tax by 15% for everyone.
- 3. That Gwynedd Council will be informed on 24.11.25 how much money Gwynedd will receive from the Government. There is no doubt that Community Councils will have to pay for more services. Another meeting will be held in February.
- 4. That Mabon ap Gwynfor and a number of Councillors have fought to get late trains back on the Cambrian line. It must be remembered 'use it or lose it'.
- 5. Recycling campaign make the most of the brown bin for recycling food waste.
- 6. Speeding is a problem everywhere.
- 7. Activities at the Camp. No answer to our latest complaint. Article in the Daily Post about work with inflatables, drones. The Ministry of Defence on site. The Camp security system has been upgraded. Several complaints have been received regarding activities at the Camp.
